However, fate distributed a cruel blow to Basanti's world twelve years ago, in the year 2012, when tragedy struck with the sudden demise of Plusti.



The loss of her beloved husband shattered Basanti's world, leaving her to grapple with the weight of grief and the scary prospect of shouldering the family's responsibilities all alone. Yet, the road ahead was fraught with challenges. Without Plusti by her side, Basanti found herself struggling to keep their grocery shop afloat amidst mounting debts and dwindling resources.

INTERVENTION OF VASUNDHARA

In November 2003, a transformative initiative began in the Deogarh district, led by Vasundhara, aimed at enhancing awareness and boosting the local economy through the utilization of Minor Forest Produce (MFPs). Recognizing the untapped potential of these natural resources, Vasundhara embarked on a mission to empower the women of the region and cultivate a sustainable platform for livelihood enhancement. With solid determination, Vasundhara set out to engage and educate the women of Gabarmunda village, laying the groundwork for a journey towards empowerment and self-reliance it was possible to create a foundation for long-term economic stability.

On March 12, 2004, through open dialogue and inclusive discussions, they aimed to communicate the potential benefits of collective action and the formation of a Producer Group (PG) focused on MFP utilization at Regdakhol village. As a result, they established a PG group named "Banani Mahila Sangha", with collaborative efforts and shared determination, Vasundhara and the villagers of Gabarmunda succeeded in establishing the PG group, marking a significant milestone in their journey towards economic empowerment. The creation of the PG group symbolized more than just economic empowerment; it represented a triumph of community solidarity and the transformative power of collective action.

JOINING BANANI MAHILA SANGHA

Within the trials of her circumstances, Basanti Nahaka found support and opportunity through her membership in the Banani Mahila Sangha Producer Group in 2016. Before joining, Basanti's financial prospects were limited by her reliance on selling Minor Forest Produce middlemen (MFPs) to at undervalued prices. However, her decision to become part of the PG marked a turning point her economic journey. in Through the collective efforts of the group and the guidance provided. thev Basanti significant underwent а transformation in her approach to selling MFPs. Armed with fresh knowledge and strategies, she learned how to effectively market her products, bypassing middlemen to access fair market prices directly. In her search for economic independence, Basanti Nahaka diversified her income streams venturing into bv various entrepreneurial sections. liters of high-quality mustard oil.
